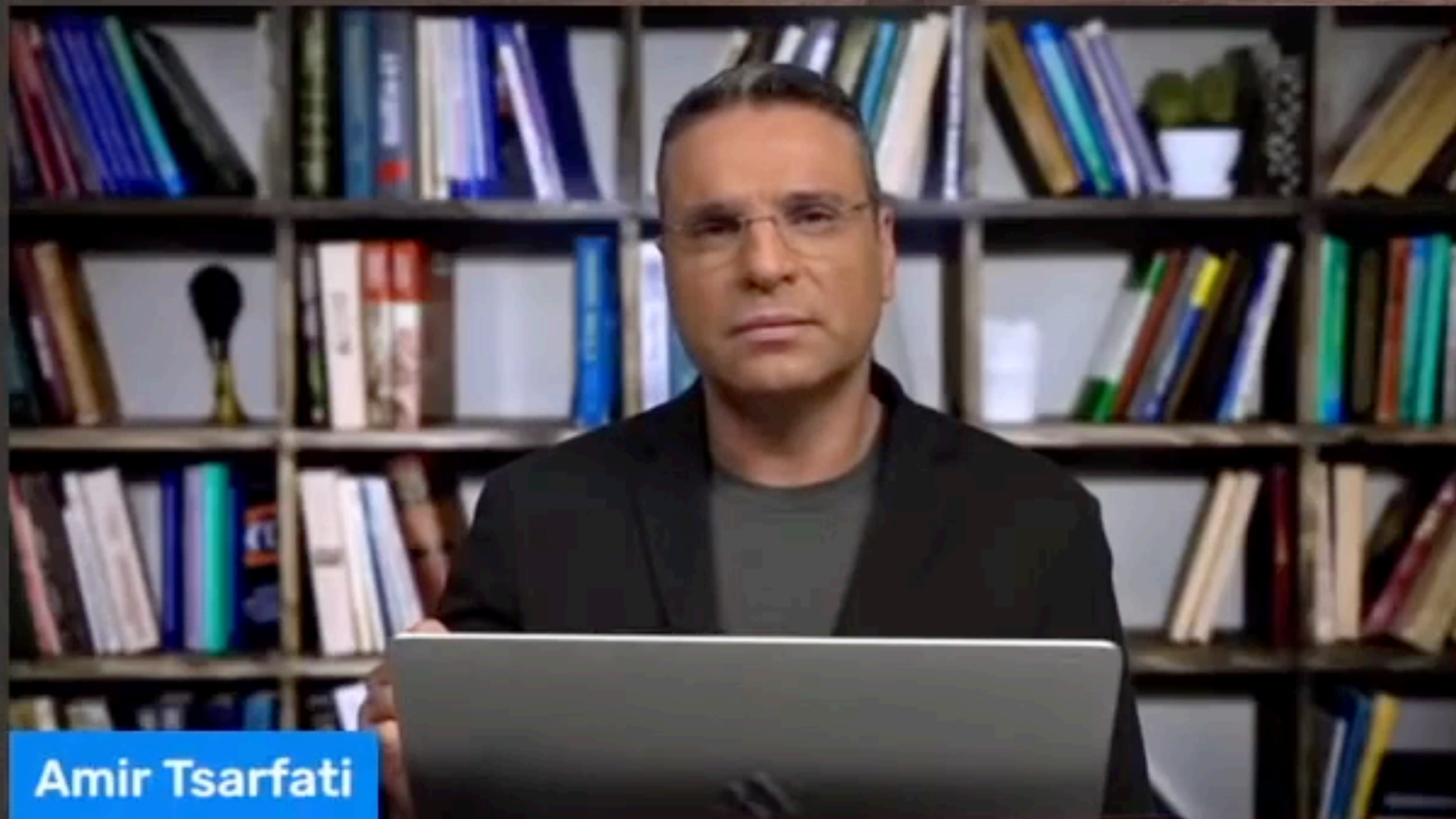

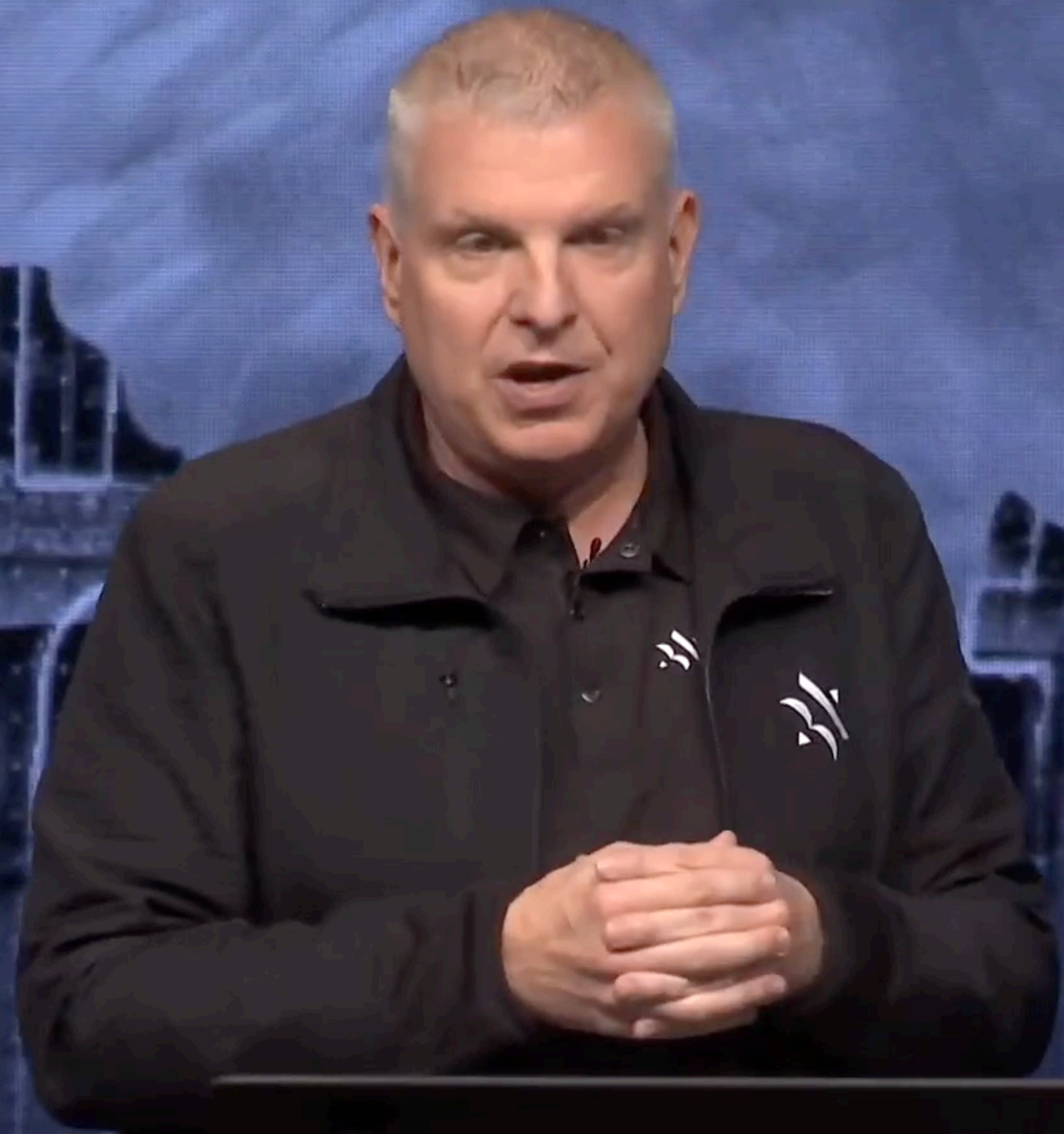

In essence it says that if God were to allow us to go through the tribulation, He would be a horrible person, unworthy of being followed.

**When I used to dialogue with Muslims a lot,
two of the most common arguments they
would employ were similar emotionally
manipulative arguments.**

Is God a child abuser?

Is God a vampire?

Atheists commonly ask why God allows suffering.

It is an accusatory question.

Does God enjoy seeing His children suffer?

**This question is an affront to these
Christians who were martyred, tortured,
etc., in the past or present.**

It fails to recognize the wisdom of the cross.
